- Edmentum offers online digital courses and curriculum for students needing credit recovery, those interested in courses not available at Monroe Central, and students who have scheduling conflicts with other classes. Additionally, Edmentum can be utilized by teachers for instructional purposes in the classroom.
- The Library Media Center is open each school day from 8:05 a.m. 3:05 p.m.
- The School Web Page is updated daily with student announcements. Many resources including the Student Handbook and Academic Planning Guide are available on this website.
- Monroe Central is a one to one school with each student being provided a Chromebook. Additional Chromebooks are available in each classroom for those who forget their Chromebook or have no charge. A wireless network is available for staff and students. The high school has a wide array of multimedia tools including DVD players, large screen TV monitors throughout the building, mobile presenters, and LCD projectors in all classrooms. Each teacher has a Chromebook to use for presentations and general school related activities. These Chromebooks are compatible with the overhead projector for screen casting.
- Student Services provides a variety of services to assist each student. Personal, educational, and career counseling is available along with information on tutoring services. Vocational/College testing and scholarship information can be accessed through the Student Services Department.

- School Safety initiatives include a detailed Emergency Preparedness Plan; a clearly defined Student Discipline Code of Conduct; a monthly random extra-curricular student drug testing program, random canine drug searches, individual identification badges for all staff members and a computer based video security system. An anti-bullying program has been implemented with reporting procedures for students, staff and parents.

Background checks are performed in the main office for all visitors prior to their admittance into the school.

- Monroe Central maintains a Self-Contained Transitions classroom to address the needs of students with moderate and severe disabilities. The classroom includes a kitchen, life skills area, and changing room.
- A Summer School program is available to support both Junior High students at risk of being retained and provides High School students with the chance to recover lost credits.
- A School Resource Officer (SRO) continues to be a valuable resource to the district. The SRO is funded via a School Safety grant.
- Grade Level Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) Grade Level PLCs consist of groups of grade level teachers that identify struggling students who are not already getting services via an IEP or 504. Teachers have developed running records that address these students' individual needs, as well as intervention strategies that have been tried, both successfully and unsuccessfully. These documents travel from one grade level to the next with the student, helping new teachers each year better meet individual students' needs and learning styles.
- Department Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) Department PLCs consist of groups of teachers from the same department. The goal for the 2024-25 school year during Department PLC time is to update curriculum maps, implement best practice instruction within each subject area, and assess for learning using a common approach utilizing multiple assessment types.



### **Data and Analysis**

#### **Data Profile Introduction**

Student performance data is a key indicator of a school's success. To ensure continuous improvement, it's essential that we leverage the data we have to enhance our practices. This data not only highlights our successes, challenges, and areas of strength, but also guides our instructional staff in refining classroom instruction. There is still significant room for improvement in applying data within the classroom. We are committed to advancing our practices in this regard. This student performance data document includes our school report card summary from the past year, a description of the standardized and local assessments we use, and current data from state and national assessments.

#### **MCHS Standardized & Local Assessments**

The following standardized assessments are utilized:

• ILEARN (Indiana Learning Evaluation Assessment Readiness Network)

The ILEARN test is a crucial exam for our junior high students, providing important data to evaluate individual student needs and assess the strengths and weaknesses of our curriculum.

Administered toward the end of the school year, the ILEARN assessment covers language arts and mathematics for seventh and eighth graders, and science for high school Biology students. The results are used to identify curriculum needs in these subject areas.

• SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Test)

All juniors will take the SAT, which will be used as the high school accountability test. Students are encouraged to retake the test to improve their scores, as these scores are important for college admissions. However, only the SAT administered at school will contribute to school accountability. We will use these scores to assess the achievement levels of our junior and senior students and pinpoint any gaps in the school curriculum. SAT scores can also serve as evidence of post-secondary readiness for graduation.

- PSAT (Pre-Scholastic Aptitude Test)
  Freshmen, Sophomores, and Juniors all take this test, which serves as preparation for the SAT. The scores help evaluate the achievement levels of both sophomores and juniors, guiding us in identifying curricular needs to better prepare students for the SAT.
- ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery)
  Juniors and seniors have the opportunity to take this test during high school. While the ASVAB is primarily used as a military entrance exam, it also helps students identify potential careers that match their interests and aptitudes. The scores from the test will aid in career counseling and can serve as evidence of post-secondary readiness for graduation.
- NWEA (Northwest Evaluation Association)
  Students in grades 7-8 take this assessment three times a year. NWEA provides assessment tools that accurately measure growth and proficiency in reading and math, offering insights to customize instruction and support students' academic development.

#### WIDA

The WIDA assessment is administered to students who use a language other than English at home. It evaluates their proficiency in English, and the results are used to develop tailored learning plans for students who might require extra support because of language barriers.



#### **Parental Participation**

#### 1. Open House

- a. An Open House is hosted at the start of each school year, allowing students and parents to meet teachers, tour the building, receive Chromebooks, and open lockers, among other activities.
- 2. Parent-teacher conferences are scheduled annually at the end of the first quarter.
- 3. Master Scheduling Student Services conducts grade specific parent nights in February to review graduation requirements and assist in course selection for the upcoming school year
- 4. Parent meetings are scheduled throughout the school year to talk about specific topics such as college and financial aid planning, dual credit requirements, etc.
- 5. Parents can receive weekly gradebook updates via email and have the ability to view their children's grades at any time through the PowerSchool portal.
- 6. Parents can follow their receptive student through Schoology by receiving a code from their child's teacher.
- 7. SwiftReach is used to send messages and emails to keep parents informed about important updates and information.


#### **Attendance**

#### **Attendance Analysis**

Based on our current data, we need to address issues with student attendance. The graph above illustrates a notable drop in attendance among students who did not reach the 94% threshold. Additionally, our overall attendance rate has decreased by two percentage points. While our rates are currently on par with the state average, we believe there is room for improvement.



#### **Discipline Data**

Monroe Central Jr.-Sr. High School is currently training all staff on the PBIS system (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports). This schoolwide framework is designed to enhance student behavior and foster a safe, effective learning environment.


PBIS operates on a tiered model that addresses students' behavioral, academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs. Its core idea is to recognize and provide feedback on positive student behavior, thereby decreasing disciplinary issues and encouraging a climate of increased productivity, safety, and learning.

Discipline data will be monitored annually to ensure that our PBIS framework is yielding positive outcomes for our school. The data provided will serve as a guide for identifying areas that need attention.



### 2023-2024 Discipline Data




### Grade Level


#### Parent Contact Method
